

# #1090: Unique Yet Classic

One of the most interesting show coaches Marathon has ever produced, coach #1090, is designed to convey a classic feel, with clean lines, contrasting colors and textures, and luxurious furniture. Interior Designer Jennifer Clausen wanted to make the coach inviting while keeping it visually interesting. "I introduced a scheme that incorporated two-tone cabinetry, adding drama and visual interest," she said. "I used contrasting textured laminates, light textures and dark wood colors, to give the space a new richness and depth I could use to introduce other unique ideas, such as the modified floorplan."

The most striking change to Marathon's classic floorplan is Jennifer's modification to the dinette. "I designed the dinette to fit two people very comfortably around a pyramid-shaped table that can be pulled out into a 'U' shape for

larger groups of people," she said. "The crowning jewel to the dinette area is the hanging pendant light fixtures above, which cascade down to fill the space with a warm glow."

Another unique variation in #1090's floorplan is its off-set bedroom. Jennifer angled the bed slightly toward the entrance, allowing space for a make-up vanity on one side of the bedroom. The bed tucks under the vanity area when the bedroom slide is in, so storage space is not compromised. The back wall is softly lit by two sconce lights, and equipped with two dresser-like cabinets that add wonderful visual appeal. *Note from the Editor: Congratulations to #1090's new owners, Rulon & Paula Harper!* •
